





CLUBS FIRST 1000KM FLIGHT

The First...and Last time I will do that...

I'd worked out it was possible.

I don't think anyone had done it before.

It would need to be close to or during summer to get enough daylight hours.

The weather would need to be consistent all day without the risk of showers or a front lurking about.

I'd need 20-30 knots SW winds all day.

Each leg would need to be at least 125 kms long such that only 4 trips would be necessary.

I'd need at least 70 litres of water (in the wings) to keep the speed up.

I'd need lunch and plenty of water...and a good book perhaps...

And lastly, the family would need to be distracted such that I wasn't required anywhere else...

1000 kms on the ridge.

Why you might ask?? A very good question which I don't really have a good answer for except "because it was there".

I created turn-points called "Kaimai 1" 10 kms south of the Tga road-crossing, and "Coro 1" just short of Manaia Bay (where SH 25 turns east). 125.6 kms between turn-points.

So the task (which will look rather repetitive...because it was);

Gordon - Kaimai 1 - Coro 1 - Kaimai 1 - Coro 1 - Kaimai 1 - Coro 1 - Kaimai 1 - Te Puru - Bop Depot - Gordon.

1500 ft tow towards the high point meant I could start straight off tow by diving towards the rail bridge and onto the nursery ridge...and we were off. I won't bore you with all the boring details because I'm sure you have all flown all or parts of the task area. The wind blew all day, there were a few showers before lunch but not heavy enough to stop for or go around. The lightest wind strength (15 knots) was around Thames (especially just north of the town) which is often the case. I barely saw another glider all day.

Stats -

Task distance 1005 kms

Average speed 156 kph

Time on task 6 hrs and 36 mins

Number of circles – none (ie I never had to stop and climb)

Average height – about 1800 ft (lowest point 1000ft at Hikataia...quite normal).

Quite rough in places which kept me to Rough Air Speed (120 knots) at times.

Consumed 2 muesli bars, drank 2.5 litres of water and expended 2 litres. 1 Bundaberg Ginger Beer and a packet of chips at the end of the day.


Washed a material amount of salt off the glider at the end of the day (sea spray off the Firth of Thames).

If I'd had the fortitude I could have done another 250 kms...but why?

Would I do it again – NO. But I've done it now, now it's your turn...(but get on with it as the wind farm proposed for Tirohia will make it much harder).

Next up...a 500km FAI triangle...harder than it sounds...




