It's summer at last and some big flights have happened over spring: three 500km plus flights, four 300km thermal flights and many 200km plus flights. Dave Johnson has a 500km diamond, and Ross Hyndman a 300km diamond. Neil Ramond nearly had a 500km diamond, but an FAI rule affecting power gliders thwarted an otherwise spectacular flight.

Tim Bromhead, Charlie Irvin, Derek Shipley, Brett Slater and Bob Gray have all been charging around the sky at Omarama, Tim has done one flight over 500km and multiple 3 and 400km flights.

Aside from the big flights, there have been other milestones for the club books. A first solo by James Godwin and conversion to NI by Aiden Cartwright. NI was due for its 3,000-hour inspection recently and Aiden had to await its return. A 3,000-hour inspection is quite an expensive exercise to complete. However, NI is in outstanding condition and fills a niche no other glider can fill.

The club has hosted several groups over the last couple of months. Young Eagles Hamilton, ATC Tokoroa/Morrinsville and a Pt Chevalier Scouts. They have all enjoyed flying with us and several new members are in the pipeline.

The club is again departing to Taupo during the Walsh. Departure is 5th Jan and return about the 22nd Jan depending on weather and availability of someone willing to tow a trailer back. The Club Class championships start at Taupo on the 18th, so any club flying will be at the behest of the Contest Director.

We have been running a bit short on duty pilots. Many are being rostered frequently and some fatigue seems to be setting in. The committee has decided to go back to running Wednesdays without one. This means everyone needs to chip in to make it work (especially if the day turns out busy). We will try to organize someone if it is heading that way. 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## **FAI AWARDS**

For many decades the club had very few '3 diamond pilots' and there was a nearly 30 year gap from one 500km diamond distance award to the next. That's all changed in the last decade and with Dave Johnson's 500km recent flight we now have 7 current flying members with 3 FAI diamonds. Ross Hyndman has recently jumped up the list by getting a 300km Gold and Diamond in one flight.

There are many on the list who are capable of flying the task, but are averse to trying to follow a very complicated set of task rules. Also expensive gear, such as special recorders or oxygen equipment are significant barriers. More of our pilots are starting to realize that none of it is unsurmountable and it is all part of the challenge. The club now has 2 Nano recorders as one was recently donated by Tony Davies. 
